Airline denies report of hijacking on Amsterdam-bound flight

DEVELOPING -- Spain-based airline Vueling said a miscommunication between a pilot and the control tower on one of its flights prompted reports of a possible hijacking, according to Reuters.

A spokeswoman for Vueling told Reuters "the plane approached the airport in an unusual way," which caused a miscommunication.

The Dutch Defense Ministry reportedly scrambled two F-16 fighter jets to intercept the passenger plane, according to Dutch website <u>nu.nl.</u> ==

The plane was en route from Malaga, Spain, to Amsterdam's Schipol Airport.

The plane has landed at Schipol Airport in Amsterdam and has been surrounded by security forces and several ambulances, according to photographers at the scene. All passengers are reportedly still on board.

National broadcaster NOS spoke by phone with a person it identified as one of the passengers on board who says that the plane was calm and there was no hostage situation.
